Prospect Cottage overlooks the harbour, no longer busy with fishermen landing their catch, but popular as a safe berthing place for yachts.



In Findochty there is a convenience store, pharmacy, hairdressers and a post office. The Admirals Bar / Restaurant serves meals in the conservatory overlooking the harbour.

A wider range of shops, including supermarkets, are available in nearby Buckie.



Attractions include wildlife-watching, historic buildings, fishing, golf, scenic harbours, clifftop walks with unbeatable views, and terrific ice cream and fish & chips! There is also a play park that is suitable for children less than 10 minutes' walk from the cottage.

The cottage comfortably sleeps six people in three bedrooms.

Downstairs there is a twin bedroom and a kitchen/diner with a table seating six people. The kitchen is equipped with an electric cooker, microwave and fridge/freezer. The large bathroom opposite has an electric overbath shower.







Upstairs has a harbour facing double bedroom, a twin bedroom and a harbour facing lounge with Smart TV and radio.

There is an outhouse with washing machine and tumble drier.





Things To Do

Picturesque Harbours: Portsoy is of particular historical interest, but see banffshiremaritime.org.uk for others you might also enjoy.

Buckie Fishing Heritage Centre: Discover the unique heritage of fishing on the Moray Firth.

Macduff Aquarium: The Moray Firth is a haven for wildlife and at Macduff Marine Aquarium you will come face to face with all kinds of sea creatures that live beneath the steely blue Moray Firth waters.

Wildlife Watching: Boat Trips are usually available from Buckie, Banff and Macduff.

Spynie Palace: The largest surviving medieval bishop's house in Scotland – residence of the bishops of Moray for 500 years. Royalty travelling in the area sometimes used the palace as a guesthouse.

Elgin Cathedral and Biblical Gardens: Even as a ruin, the cathedral shines out as one of Scotland's most ambitious and beautiful medieval buildings. The gardens sit behind a wall to the side of Elgin Cathedral. Identify plants mentioned in the Bible and look at statues depicting scenes from the parables!

Baxters Highland Village: The Baxters Highland Village offers a variety of speciality shops, stocked with a wide range of Baxters and Audrey Baxter range of food products, as well as wines, whisky and gin, speciality foods, cookware and gifts.

Duff House: As home to noted art collectors, Duff House has long been adorned with magnificent paintings. It later played an active role in the Second World War. Today, Duff House is a country house gallery displaying collections from the National Galleries of Scotland.

Moray Coastal Trail: A comprehensive collection of Moray ways for walking, horse riding, cycling, sailing and canoeing to help you get out in beautiful Moray. morayways.org.uk

Golf: Local courses Strathlene Golf Club and Cullen Golf Club.

Spey Bay: This is situated at the mouth of the River Spey. Although not guaranteed, dolphin and osprey sightings are a frequent occurrence here. Free admission to exhibition area, shop and cafe.

Fishing: Sea fishing is available in the area. Tynet Trout Fishery, between Fochabers and Buckie do freshwater fishing. Telephone 01542 850411 for information.

Beaches: Burghead Bay is a lovely curved bay stretching 11 miles from Findhorn beach to Burghead but you might also enjoy the beaches at Hopeman, Lossiemouth and Cullen.

Booking & Policy
